

Selangor BN reps may send memo to Sultan over Teng's SMS

KLANG: The Selangor Barisan Nasional assemblymen are considering sending a memorandum to the Sultan over Speaker [Datuk Teng Chang Khim](#)'s SMS to executive councillors on what to highlight in their winding-up speeches at the recent state assembly sitting.

Kuang assemblyman Abdul Shukur Idrus, who is also Selangor Umno information chief, however, said he would first consult state Opposition leader [Datuk Satim Diman](#) and other Barisan Nasional assemblymen before doing so.

"We are extremely unhappy over the SMS. Our voices need to be heard," he added.

Kuala Kubu Baru assemblyman Wong Koon Mun said it would be pointless to file a motion against Teng as they would not get the necessary majority to pass it.

"There are only 21 of us (BN reps) in the House. Our cry will not be heard. So, tabling a motion against the Speaker is out.

"But everyone is watching what is happening in Selangor. It is proven that he (Teng) is biased. We (Barisan reps) will let the people judge for themselves," he said.

Teng could not be reached for his comments.

On Tuesday, six Barisan assemblymen staged a walk-out in protest after discovering Teng's text message.

"This is possibly the last winding-up session for exco, opportunity should be fully used to talk about our success in the past four years like what (Kota Anggerik assemblyman) Yaakob (Sapari) is doing," the SMS had stated.

Teng had accidentally sent the SMS to former Exco member [Datuk Dr Hasan Ali](#), who allegedly forwarded the text message to the Barisan members just before the assembly meeting started that day.

The furious assemblymen who stepped out the House were [Datuk Isa Abu Kassim](#) (Batang Kali), [Datuk Shamsuddin Lias](#) (Sungai Burong), Wong Koon Mun (Kuala Kubu Baru), Abdul Shukur Idrus (Kuang), Badrul Hisham Abdullah (Port Klang) and [Datuk Abdul Rahman Palil](#) (Sementa).
