

**Having Breakfast With DPM A Proud Moment For Razali

TASEK GELUGOR, Sept 17 (Bernama) -- It really made Razali Ismail's day when deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin invited him for breakfast and a chit chat at the Tasek Gelugor Public market here today.

Razali, 75, a retired teacher from Padang Menora here, said this was the first time in his life he came up close with a top government leader.

"I heard several days ago the deputy prime minister was coming to Tasek Glugor. Although, I was not feeling well, I still came here because I really wanted to meet him.

"It was a proud and happy moment when he invited me to sit with him for breakfast. I will cherish this experience," he told reporters, here, today.

"He asked me about my health and my family. Although, it was short conversation, it was very meaningful. Clearly, our deputy prime minister is a leader with a common touch (berjiwa rakyat)," he said.

On a one-day working visit to Penang, Muhyiddin also spent 20 minutes at a stall ran by Sharifah Ibrahim, for coffee, fried vermicelli (bihun goreng) and pudding.

When met, Sharifah, 42, who had been operating the stall for the past 15 years, said she made some preparations when she found out the deputy prime minister was coming for a visit.

She said she was very happy when Muhyiddin picked her stall to have breakfast.

Muhyiddin then had a dialogue with traders present before walking 200 metres to the railway twin-track project. Along the way, he spent 30 minutes, talking to shopowners.

Muhyiddin then visited the Permatang Pauh parliamentary constituency for a special meeting with religious teachers from all over the state at Universiti Technology Mara's branch campus there.
