

**PAS Has Duped People Of Kelantan Enough, Says Muhyiddin

KUALA KRAI, Feb 2 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin today urged the people of Kelantan not to be further duped by the PAS government in the state and instead give the Barisan Nasional (BN) a chance to champion their welfare after the next general election (GE).

Muhyiddin said PAS' promises to the people of Kelantan since it came into power in the state in 1990 were mere lies and because of this, the party should be rejected in the next GE.

"If promises are unfulfilled it is `belawok' (lying). If in Islam, what is the punishment for lying?."

"Matters on Earth and the hereafter must go together. This is what Islam calls for and if we do not have the ability to do this, there is no point being in power. We (BN) will do a better job than PAS. This is not talking big or being arrogant," he said when addressing a "Meet-the-People" session at Sekolah Kebangsaan Manik Urai Baru here Thursday.

Also present was his wife Puan Sri Norainee Abdul Rahman, International Trade and Industry Minister Datuk Seri Mustapa Mohamed, Agriculture and Agro-based Industry Minister Datuk Seri Noh Omar and Deputy Finance Minister Datuk Dr Awang Adek Hussin.

More than 15,000 people of various races attended the function in which Muhyiddin also handed over Bantuan Rakyat 1Malaysia (BR1M) aid to 30 residents of the district.

Touching on the BR1M aid, Muhyiddin said a total of RM7.7 million had been set aside for 15,494 eligible recipients of the RM500 aid per household in the district.

He also announced a special allocation of RM2.2 million for remedial work at a hillslope facing Sekolah Rendah Jenis Kebangsaan Cina Yuk Chai.

"Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak has agreed to make the allocation so that the slope can be repaired."

"Whether it is a Chinese school or Tamil school, all are our schools and we will help them all," he said.

He said it was not like PAS which at one time promised to give RM100 to each senior citizen but till today it remained just that, a promise.

"In the Manik Urai by-election in 2009, I went to Masjid Temalir (Mosque) which the state government said it could not afford to expand to cater for a bigger congregation. Out of concern we gave a RM600,000 allocation for the purpose," he said.

Muhyiddin also said he hoped all quarters were ready to ensure the BN won Kelantan in the next GE.

"Although I don't know the date of the next GE, do the people of Kelantan still want to be under PAS? I hope you will leave PAS and pick the BN," he said.
