

**Do Not Fall Prey To Sweet Talk Of Opposition - Muhyiddin

MUAR, March 3 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin today advised the people not to fall prey to the sweet talk of the opposition political parties, saying they will not be able to fulfill their electoral promises of various kinds of aid.

He said they made these promises solely to garner the people's support to win the next general election, but would be unable to keep their word.

"Kedah is an example. They have not been able to solve the water supply problem and other amenities for the people.

"The dirty water causes illness among the people," he said when opening a 1Malaysia Shop (KR1M) in Bukit Pasir, here.

He said only the Barisan Nasional (BN) government can provide various subsidies and aid, including the 1Malaysia People's Aid (BR1M) which involves an allocation of RM16.38 billion.

He said the one-off RM500 aid for households earning a monthly income of less than RM3,000 was to offset the higher prices of goods.

Muhyiddin said the government introduced the KR1M to enable the middle- and low-income people to purchase goods at prices lower than in the ordinary shops.

Meanwhile, at Sekolah Menengah Vokasional in Jalan Sungai Abong here where he launched the Johor-level 1Malaysia Community Programme organised by the Information, Communications and Culture Ministry, Muhyiddin called on the people to reject the neo-liberal ideology of the opposition.

He said the ideology could cause problems for the country one day because it was unsuitable as it clashed with the customs, culture and religions of multi-racial Malaysia.

"They want to abolish laws relating to sodomy, free sex, and this goes against the customs, culture and religions of the country," he said.

Muhyiddin also said that the per capita income of the country had risen to US\$9,500 from US\$7,000 last year after the government implemented the Government Transformation Programme and the Economic Transformation Programme.

"BR1M, KR1M, aid to students and various other types of assistance have been accepted by 80 per cent of the people in the country and has put fright into the opposition which is unable to match these," he said.

As such, he said, volunteers under the 1Malaysia Community (K1M) should form the bulwark in safeguarding the customs, culture and religions of the country against the dangers brought about by extreme freedom.
