

**Nation's Peace And Unity Must Be Maintained - Muhyiddin

KUALA LUMPUR, Jan 6 (Bernama) -- Peace and unity in a multi-racial and multi-religious society is the one privilege enjoyed by the country which needs to be maintained to achieve the nation's aim of a developed status by 2020.

Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said the situation was such since a long time ago, even before the 1Malaysia concept was introduced.

"We accept although we're different, we are Malaysians, we respect one another, we don't look down upon each other, because we know, we are citizens in one Malaysia," he said during the 1Malaysia meet the people session in Taman Bukit Maluri, Kepong here, Friday.

In fact, he said Malaysia was considered a role model by foreign leaders who were impressed with the unity of the multi-racial communities which co-exist in the country.

Therefore, he urged the people not to be influenced by irresponsible parties who invited them to join demonstrations, assemblies and so on, aimed at creating chaos.

He said such actions not only create disturbances in the country but portrays the country in a negative light and leads to bad consequences.

Muhyiddin also hoped that people can make an intelligent choice in the upcoming general election by electing the government with a clear development vision for the country.

"We make careful evaluations because we want to solve our problems because 10 years down the line we not only want to become a developed nation but the people must also have good income too. We have a clear plan," he said.

"PKR's plan is unclear, they're now confused as to whether it's PKR, DAP or PAS, all kinds of issues are surfacing," he added.

"Today, we know their leaders are facing a big problem, they have no vision, they don't explain to the people what they're going to do in the next 10 years, they can't promise what is important for the people," he said.

Muhyiddin announced a RM50,000 allocation to repair the Yee Lan temple in Bukit Maluri and handed over the approval letter for the gazetting of the temple land.
