

**Comprehensive Structure Needed For Student Mobility Programme - Khaled Bernama**  
**March 2, 2012**

PUTRAJAYA, March 2 (Bernama) - The country's student mobility programme must be comprehensively structured to include, among others, a recognised credit transfer system in order to be successful, said Higher Education Minister Datuk Seri Mohamed Khaled Nordin.

He stressed that the programme must involve credit transfer to enable the students to acquire sufficient credit.

"In this regard, the credit transfer system must be clearly defined and uniform as a guideline in implementing the mobility programme," he said at the launch of the Malaysia-China Student Mobility Programme at his office here today.

Twenty students from four public institutions of higher learning (IPTA), namely Universiti Malaya (UM), Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM) and Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI) will leave for China on Sunday to undergo a Chinese language communication programme at Beijing Sport University for three months.

The students will be in China for another three months for industrial training at selected companies and universities.
