

**PSC Will Go On Without Opposition Representatives - Khaled
Bernama
March 24, 2012**

SUNGAI SIPUT, March 24 (Bernama) -- The Parliamentary Select Committee (PSC) on the Lynas Advanced Materials Plant project will be set up even though it does not have representatives from the opposition said Lynas PSC chairman Datuk Seri Khaled Nordin.

He said the committee was established to study the issue of the rare earth factory in Gebeng, Pahang based on the truth, knowledge and scientific research as the people wanted certainty on the matter.

"Whether the opposition agrees or not, the committee will be set up, ..we will do our best as entrusted on us," he told reporters after launching the Sungai Siput Community College as a Automotive Industry Hub and a Strategic Collaboration programme today.

Khaled said the roles and responsibilities of the committee will be implemented when the list of committee members was announced in Parliament.

"We were given three months to carry out the responsibility, and we would be informed by Parliament when we start.

"As we have been informed the opposition does not want to be involved or cooperate, Parliament might take more time to decide on the committee members," he said.

Last week, the Cabinet was reported to have given the green light to the establishment of the PSC and the Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Datuk Seri Mohd Nazri Abdul Aziz was reported as saying that the committee would be headed by Khaled with four members from Barisan Nasional, three opposition and one independent.
