

Politicians Advised To Make Police Report If Threatened

KUALA LUMPUR, March 26 (Bernama) -- Politicians in the country have been asked to make a police report if they feel they are being threatened.

Home Minister Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Tun Hussein said failure to do so would make it difficult for police to ensure their safety, especially when attending ceramah (public talks).

"But if they have not informed the police and something happens to them, then they cannot blame the police," he told reporters at the Parliament lobby, here.

On the incident of Deputy Education Minister Datuk Dr Wee Ka Siong being "attacked" at a gathering discussing Chinese education in Kajang Sunday, Hishammuddin believed that if the police had been informed earlier on Wee's presence, the incident could have been avoided.

A news portal reported that Wee was chased out of the gathering by the United Chinese School Committees Association (Dong Zong) which was protesting against the shortage of Chinese school teachers.
