

Electoral rolls on display nationwide

KUALA LUMPUR: The Election Commission (EC) yesterday put on display, for the next 14 days, the supplementary electoral rolls for the first quarter of 2012.

It said in a statement the rolls were on display at 15 state election offices, 451 computerised post offices, 86 government complexes/offices, 124 district/land offices, 48 district/municipal council offices, 194 multipurpose halls/rukun tetangga posts/community halls/penghulu offices/halls and 34 other places.

The rolls can also be inspected on the EC website at www.spr.gov.my.

The EC said 289,255 new applications for registration as electors and 104,430 applications for a change in polling districts were received in the first three months of this year.

"New applicants and people who have changed their polling district are advised to check the rolls," it said.

The EC said those who had just applied for registration as electors who failed to find their names in the rolls should put in a claim on Form B.

Electors who would like to object to the entry of names in the rolls can do so on Form C.

The forms should be submitted to the registrar (state election director) for the registration area on a working day during the time of display of the rolls, said the statement.

The EC advised those who wanted to object to ensure that they had strong grounds to do so.
