

PM looks forward to Cameron's visit

KUALA LUMPUR: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Razak said the relationship between Malaysia and Britain had not only stood the test of time, it had flourished.

Speaking ahead of British Prime Minister David Cameron's visit yesterday, he said it will strengthen and deepen bilateral ties between the two nations.

"Economically, culturally and politically, the bilateral relationship between Malaysia and Britain has not only stood the test of time, it has flourished.

"Malaysia and Britain are united by our shared values, and by our commitment to increasing prosperity, raising living standards and building open, outward-facing economies", Najib said.

In his Facebook posting and microblogging website Twitter, Najib said he was looking forward to the British prime minister's visit.

"I'm looking forward to welcoming David Cameron to Malaysia tomorrow. It has been a long time since the last visit from a British PM," he said.

The last British Prime Minister to visit Malaysia was John Major in 1993.

Cameron will make a two-day official visit to Malaysia beginning today.

"In this, the Diamond Jubilee year of Her Majesty the Queen, there can be no better moment to celebrate the historic ties between our nations", Najib said.
