

Najib: Solution to domestic help stalemate will be discussed with Indonesia

KUIALA LUMPUR: Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak is working on a solution to the Indonesian maid issue.

"Working out a quick solution to this domestic maid issue. I had discussed it with President Susilo last Wednesday," he posted on his Twitter handle @NajibRazak last night.

His assurance to Malaysians looking to hire Indonesian maids comes fresh from his meeting with the Indonesian president at the recent 20th Asean Summit in Phnom Penh.

It was previously reported that the expected arrival of domestic maids from Indonesia in early March had been delayed by another month.

Najib also wrote a wall post on his Facebook page (www.facebook.com/najibrazak), detailing some of his achievements as Prime Minister in the past three years.

"Three years have now passed since I've been given the mandate to govern and serve as your Prime Minister. It feels like the time has flown by! But at the same time, I'm very proud of how much has been done so far.

> Extra RM3bil in the form of direct assistance to ease cost of living channelled back to the rakyat.

> Street crimes down by 39% while crime rate in general has decreased by 11%.

> Primary and Secondary education made absolutely free for the first time in history.

> Per Capita Income rose to RM29,726 (US\$9,700) from RM20,532 (US\$6,700).

"Foreign Direct Investment increased by 12.3% to RM32.9 billion in 2011 compared to RM29.3 billion in 2010, showing stronger global confidence in Malaysia."

> Measures outlined in the ETP are expected to create a total of 313,000 new jobs.

"The progress we have made is something we should all be proud of. If you agree, please share this with your friends so they can see for themselves," he said in the post.

Earlier yesterday, Najib said the 1Malaysia concept which emphasises inclusivity is in line with Islamic principles.

"The concept has enabled us to live in harmony. With the moderation approach, we are the best example of a multi-racial and multi-religious Muslim country," he said at a special assembly with some 5,000 officials and staff members of the Federal Territory Islamic Religious Council.
