

**Voters Must Change Ways To End Political Corruption - IIM

KUALA LUMPUR, April 5 (Bernama) -- Political corruption could only be ended if voters and the people change their ways, said Malaysian Institute of Integrity (IIM) president Datuk Dr Mohd Tap.

He said although politicians had long been associated with corruption, the scenario was also contributed by demanding voters.

In the United Kingdom, he said politicians represented the electorate in Parliament on policy matters, but need not go down to the grassroots to give handouts.

On the other hand, he said elected representatives in Malaysia would have to kowtow to voters, fork out money to them or attend menial events such as weddings in their constituencies.

"Voters here seek help from politicians, not only for financial aid, but also to get a university admission for their children," he told a news conference on the forthcoming IIM's eight anniversary and National Integrity Plan, today.
