

**Original Copies Of Constitution Among Top Attractions At "Our King" Exhibition

April 15, 2012**

KUALA LUMPUR, April 15 (Bernama) -- The original copy of the Federal Constitution is among the top attractions of the "Our King" exhibition which is being held for the first time at Istana Negara Lama here in conjunction with the installation of Kedah Sultan Tuanku Abdul Halim Mu'adzam Shah as the 14th Yang di-Pertuan Agong.

This is the first time the document is being exhibited for public viewing. Other attractions include royal regalia.

Tuanku Abdul Halim opened the exhibition today. Tuanku Abdul Halim and Raja Permaisuri Agong Tuanku Hajah Haminah's arrival at Istana Negara Lama at 10.50am was welcomed by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak and wife Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor.

Also present were Information, Communications and Culture Minister Datuk Seri Dr Rais Yatim, who is also the chairman of the Special Committee for the installation, his wife Datin Seri Maznah Rais, several Cabinet ministers and foreign dignitaries.

After opening the exhibition, Their Majesties were brought on a tour of the exhibition by the prime minister and his wife before adjourning to a luncheon.

At the function, Tuanku Abdul Halim also presented booklets titled "Our King" to four students of different races to symbolise 1Malaysia.

In his speech, His Majesty said the exhibition brought fond memories as he had resided in the palace when he was the 5th Yang di-Pertuan Agong from 1970-75.

"I am very happy that this exhibition is being held here because a lot of historical events took place at this palace. I hope the people will benefit much from this exhibition," he said.

Rais, in his speech, said the exhibition would help the people, particularly the younger generation, value the significance of the royal institution to the country.

He said the copies of the booklet would also be distributed to schools and the public for the same purpose.

Speaking to reporters later, he said of late, an ugly culture was rearing its head where certain parties were not showing deference to the Malay rulers who symbolised the constitutional monarchy practised in the country.

"There will always be such people around, even in Britain (which also practises the constitutional monarchy system). But there is a limit, which if crossed, can result in the offender to face the full brunt of the law. Let this be a reminder," he said.

The exhibition is open to the public from tomorrow. It ends on June 15 and visiting time is from 9am to 5pm.
