

Selangor MB Not Commenting On Anwar Ibrahim's Proposal

PUTRAJAYA, April 19 (Bernama) -- Selangor Menteri Besar Tan Sri Abdul Khalid Ibrahim today refused to comment on Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim's proposal not to dissolve the state assembly even if parliament is dissolved to pave the way for the general election.

Anwar had suggested that this should be the decision if the electoral roll involving Selangor voters is not cleaned up by the Election Commission.

"I do not want to answer on this matter," Abdul Khalid told reporters after a meeting with EC chairman Tan Sri Abdul Aziz Mohd Yusof, here, Thursday.

However, Anwar's proposal did not involve three more state governments under opposition rule, namely Penang, Kedah and Kelantan.

Previously, Abdul Khalid said the Selangor state assembly would not be dissolved even if Parliament was, and Pakatan was only willing to participate in the 13th general election if held after June, 2012.

Abdul Khalid said today's meeting focused on various issues including cleaning up the electoral roll in Selangor involving the transfer of voters' names to another area without their knowledge.
