

**SAPP Calls Federal Government To Set Up Sabah Branch Of Federal PSC**

KOTA KINABALU, April 6 (Bernama) -- Sabah Progressive Party (SAPP) has called on the Federal government to set up the Sabah branch of the Federal Public Services Commission (PSC).

In making the call, SAPP Supreme Council Member Kent Yong said the setting up of the commission was necessary so that the Borneonisation promises as stated in the Malaysian agreement could be implemented so as to provide jobs to Sabahans in the Federal departments and agencies.

He said the commission as stated in the agreement would have full authority in respect of all appointments, promotions and discipline of the Federal Public Services in Sabah.

The Sarawak branch of the Federal Public Services Commission was responsible on matters regarding recruitment and service for members of the Federal Public Service in Sarawak, he said in a statement, here today.

Yong said that its Secretariat provided consultancy services to the public on career opportunities in the public service as well as managing the services of the federal department personnel throughout Sarawak.

According to him, the said Inter-Governmental Report states that Natives of Sabah and Sarawak shall be given preference over other candidates for all the posts in the State and Federal Public Departments in Sabah and Sarawak.

"Unfortunately, the Sabah branch of the Federal Public Services Commission which will have full authority in respect of all appointments, promotions and discipline of the Federal public Service in Sabah has not been set-up yet, since Merdeka until now," he said.
