

**Ministry to review guidelines on security at schools, says Muhyiddin**

MUAR: Security measures in schools must be heightened and all visitors monitored and screened, said Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin.

Although the Education Ministry had issued guidelines on the matter years ago, the matter needed a new approach now, added Muhyiddin, also the Education Minister.

He said the recent kidnapping of 12-year-old Nayati Shamelin Moodliar had prompted the ministry to re-look at the guidelines.

"I am very grateful that Nayati has been found and is safe. This makes us realise the importance of tightening security to protect students not only inside the school compounds but outside as well," he said after receiving 15,000 footballs from Berjaya Corporation, 7-Eleven and Cosway Berhad yesterday.

He added a post-Cabinet meeting held on Wednesday also touched on the security approaches to be adopted at schools, including setting up security parameters around them.

"We need to know who approaches the school as some may pose as relatives, saying they want to take the student out for lunch but the actual intention is to kidnap the child," he said.
