

Test BN, Kelantan told

GUA MUSANG: Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak has called on the people of Kelantan to rally behind Barisan Nasional, which has promised to bring about monumental changes should it succeed in "conquering" the state in the general election.

The Prime Minister said the rakyat should "try and test" Barisan to know the coalition's capability.

"I am truly committed to bringing changes to this state. Whatever development the people yearn for can be delivered.

"Give Barisan a chance and we will prove to you the changes that can take place in Kelantan," he said when launching the 1Malaysia community carnival.

He named the Gua Musang and Jeli parliamentary areas as Barisan's stronghold in Kelantan.

At the launch of the Rural Transformation Centre in Kota Baru, Najib said Barisan was formulating a manifesto for Kelantan and once it was ready, the rakyat could view what the coalition had in store for them.

Najib added that the people should believe in the power of transformation rather than reformation.

By undergoing transformation, the people could advance themselves as the Government had put in place various policies that would benefit them, he said.

"The people of Kelantan are known for their business acumen. Whatever they sell will be profitable. If they want to further *untung* (profits), they should choose Barisan," he said.

He also noted that PAS was making yet another political statement in wanting to amend the Federal Constitution and do away with Islam as the official religion if Pakatan Rakyat came into power.

PAS, he said, had made many changes to its policies, pointing out that it had changed from wanting to set up an Islamic state to becoming a welfare state on DAP's insistence.

"They wanted to implement hudud but this has died down because of opposition from its partners.

"Now, they want to take away Islam as the official religion and change it to *addin* (way of life)."
