

**Sabahans in interior looking forward to PM's Kaamatan visit**

KOTA KINABALU: Folk in the Keningau and Tambunan districts are looking forward to the weekend visit by Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

The Prime Minister will be launching the national-level Kaamatan or Harvest Festival celebration at the Keningau sports complex this evening by cutting padi stalks.

Previously, the Kaamatan celebration had been held in the state capital only, Keningau district officer Ahmad Mohd Yusof said.

Before that, Najib accompanied by his wife Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor, would launch Yayasan Sabah's RM32mil handicraft centre just outside Keningau town.

The Prime Minister will then head to the sub-district of Sook, 60km from Keningau, where he will open the Keningau Integrated Livestock Centre, a project under the Sabah Development Corridor.

On Sunday, Najib will go on a walkabout at the popular Keningau tamu grounds to meet the people as well as have breakfast with them.

He will then head to Bingkor township, about 20km away where he will visit another tamu before launching a historic home, the Rumar Besar Bingkor of the late community leader OKK Sedomon Gunsanad.

He will then head to Tambunan where he will launch the KDM College and also go on a walkabout at Posompuruan Square in Tambunan.

Chief Minister Datuk Musa Aman, who was in Keningau to oversee preparations, said the interior districts were all geared up for the Prime Minister's visit.

"We are fortunate the weather has been kind so far and we hope it will continue to be good," he said.
