

Fight Breaks Out With Presence Of Two Opposing Groups At PM's Office

PUTRAJAYA, May 2 (Bernama) -- The presence of more than 200 supporters from MIC and Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) at the Prime Minister's Office today, each claiming to be protecting the rights of the Indian community caused a commotion which degenerated into a fight.

The MIC group led by its national Youth chief T.Mohan was said to have come to the PM's Office to thank Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak for his concern and having addressed issues faced by the Indian community such as Tamil schools, temples, economic problems and citizenship.

Meanwhile, it was learnt that PKR supporters led by party vice-president N.Surendran and Wanita chief Zuraidah Kamaruddin was present to apply for a MyKad for a Form Five female student said to be unable to register to sit for the Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) examination as she does not have an identity card.

The gathering started peacefully at 11.30am when both groups held a procession and shouting their respective slogans.

However, after a heated exchange of words between the supporters of both groups, a fight broke out with two people injured and sent to Putrajaya Hospital for treatment.
