

**Breaking Through The Police Barrier Was 'Modus Operandi' Of Opposition - Dr M

PUTRAJAYA, April 30 (Bernama) -- Breaking through the police barrier during Saturday's assembly was a deliberate move, and a normal 'modus operandi' of the opposition.

Claiming that it reflected the reputation of the opposition leader, former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad said it was the norm for the opposition to instigate the people first, and then disappear.

"Well, this was his (Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim) reputation the last time (around) when they (opposition) demonstrated when I was the prime minister.

"He will instigate the people and then, he will disappear. That is normal modus operandi by Anwar, he will instigate the people and then, he will run away so that people can't accuse him," he told reporters at a press conference here today.

In a Malaysian Insider report today, Anwar, who is PKR advisor, and PKR deputy president Azmin Ali, denied that they were 'signalling' to break into a police barrier during the rally, insisting that the opposition leader had asked the PKR deputy president to negotiate with the police.

Dr Mahathir said, overturning the police car was a deliberate action of the opposition. So, too, was the manner the policemen were beaten up.

"I don't know whether you want to believe it or not, I saw the people overturning the car, and they don't look like policemen to me," he added.
