

Opposition's Tan Seng Giaw Praises Prime Minister's Setting Up Of PSC On Electoral Reform

KUALA LUMPUR, April 5 (Bernama) -- Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak's effort of setting up the Parliamentary Select Committee on Electoral Reform has won praise from an opposition member of the Dewan Rakyat.

Dr Tan Seng Giaw (DAP-Kepong) said it was a good move and in line with the objective of having free, clean and fair elections in this country.

He also voiced satisfaction with the commitment shown by the prime minister to ensuring that each win by Barisan Nasional or others in the coming general election would be achieved through the right means and not through any irregularity.

"The prime minister himself had told that the motive of him forming the PSC was to see that the election process be carried out in a free, clean and fair manner as he does not want to win the elections through fraud.

"I was really happy to hear this from him as this is a very good move," Tan said when debating on the Supply Bill (2011) 2012 in the Dewan Rakyat today.

Earlier, he admitted that some of the proposals contained in the PSC final report tabled on Tuesday were reasonable and should be implemented by the Election Commission (EC).
