

RCI Should Remedy Existence Of Dubious Names In Electoral Roll, Says Radin

KOTA KINABALU, April 18 (Bernama) -- Parti Bersatu Sabah (PBS) vice-president Datuk Radin Malleh opined that the only way to remedy the existence of 22,000 dubious names in the electoral roll is by forming a Royal Commission of Inquiry (RCI).

As such, he said the federal government should set up the RCI immediately and do the job properly, meticulously, professionally, articulately and without fear or favour.

"We in PBS wants the RCI to be formed in the interest of sovereignty, security of the nation and also for the benefit of our future generations, the true Malaysians of Sabah origin," he said in a statement, here today.

Radin, who is also Assistant Minister to the Chief Minister, was commenting on the statement by Election Commission (EC) Tan Sri Abdul Aziz Mohd Yusof yesterday that the EC expected a more challenging task in managing this coming 13th general election as the contest between the contesting parties was expected to be more intense than in previous elections.

Abdul Aziz was also quoted as saying that only 0.3 per cent of the 12.6 million voters were classified as dubious voters following checks on their records with the National Registration Department (NRD), and about 22,000 of them were classified as dubious voters when their identification cards prepared by the NRD were not collected for more than 20 years.
