

**Parliament: Opposition Dissatisfied With Improved Electoral Process As Long As Not In Power**

KUALA LUMPUR, April 19 (Bernama) -- The opposition will never be satisfied with improvements to the electoral process for as long as they are not in power and Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim is not the prime minister, Datuk Ibrahim Ali (Independent-Pasir Mas) told parliamentarians Thursday.

"For as long as they are not in power, they will continue to say that the Election Commission (EC) is not clean. That is why the EC and other relevant authorities need to be firm in implementing and enforcing the general election regulations as they (opposition) could create trouble.

"We now have a prime minister (Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak) who is urbane and open, especially in enhancing the electoral process but the opposition is still not satisfied. This is their political game."

Ibrahim said this when debating on the Election Offences (Amendments) Bill 2012 at the second reading in the Dewan Rakyat, here, Thursday.

He said it was difficult to do a thorough clean-up of the electoral roll for as long as there were certain quarters who transferred the names of voters to certain areas for their own vested interest.
