

**BN Government Driven By Commitment To Bring Prosperity To The People -  
Muhyiddin

KOTA BELUD, April 28 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said today the Barisan Nasional (BN) government was driven by commitment and initiative to continue to bring prosperity to the people.

"We do not have a magic wand. What we do have are commitment, policies and programmes. These programmes are planned not for a year or two but for five to 10 years.

"We gather the assets and put in the effort to derive more revenue so that the people, even in the rural areas, can enjoy development," he said at a meet-the-people session at Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Narinang where he handed over 1Malaysia People's Aid (BR1M) and joined the people at a 1Malaysia lunch.

Also present were Muhyiddin's wife, Puan Sri Noorainee Abdul Rahman, Sabah Chief Minister Datuk Seri Musa Aman and his wife, Datin Seri Faridah Tussin.

Muhyiddin, who began a two-day visit to Sabah yesterday, said the government was not satisfied with the level of progress achieved thus far and wanted to implement more development programmes for the people.

"Our responsibility does not rest there. We want the development to continue, to achieve Vision 2020 (of becoming a developed country)," he told an estimated 10,000 people.

Referring to the Kota Belud area which has been targeted by the opposition over the proposed construction of a dam, Muhyiddin said the opposition was only good at exploiting the local people.

He said the government worked hard to resolve the people's problems at all times and not just on the eve of elections.

Muhyiddin said the people in Sabah should not have any doubt about development because the federal government would not marginalise the state which had seen much development under Chief Minister Musa's administration.

Earlier, Muhyiddin and Musa went on a walkabout for about an hour in Kota Belud town.
