

War Crimes Committed Under Bush's Orders, Says Prosecution

KUALA LUMPUR, May 9 (Bernama) -- The Kuala Lumpur War Crimes Tribunal Wednesday was told that former United States (US) President George W. Bush and his associates had issued executive orders to commit war crimes.

Led by Prof Gurdial Singh Nijar, the prosecution submitted that Bush and seven others should be brought before the International Criminal Court (ICC) as they were the real criminals.

He said since the September 11 attacks against American targets, the US was in denial over the existence of the Geneva Convention, wanting others to follow their way and being subjected to their laws.

Gurdial Singh said according to Bush, al-Qaeda or Taliban members should not be subjected to the Geneva Convention.

He highlighted that key parts of the convention stated that prisoners must be treated humanely at all times and they must be protected against acts of violence or intimidation, and against insults and public curiosity.
