

**Mubarak Hits Out At Certain Group Trying To Topple Government Undemocratically**

ALOR SETAR, May 7 (Bernama) -- The Malaysian Council of Former Elected Representatives (Mubarak) has strongly condemned the continuous efforts by certain groups using force such as through revolution, bloodshed or other undemocratic means which are against the constitution to topple the government elected by the people.

In a motion tabled at the ninth Mubarak annual general assembly here today, the council also criticised the actions of the opposition parties and certain non-governmental organisations (NGOs) which are masterminded by foreign powers including the International Zionist Movement to realise their objectives.

Mubarak information head Datuk Abdul Rahman Sulaiman, when tabling the motion, said Mubarak urged the people to always be wary against such efforts in order to save the country and ensure the people's prosperity and survival in the years to come.

"Mubarak also took the stand to support the efforts of the government to preserve the existing system of administration permanently," he said.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak on Friday said the gathering organised by the NGOs and supported by the opposition in the federal capital on April 28, was an attempt to topple the government chosen by the people under a democratic system.
