

Muhyiddin warns against stirring racial tension

TAIPING: Malaysia has laws to prevent those with vested interests who are out to cause racial tension in the country, said Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin.

"These people can be penalised under laws such as the Sedition Act, to stop their actions so we can live in peace," he said.

He added that Barisan Nasional would always maintain racial unity so the Government could implement all its plans.

"The Government is committed to implementing its agenda of development for the people, regardless of race and background," he said at the *Jelajah Janji Ditepati* carnival at the Advanced Technology Training Centre in Kamunting, near here, yesterday.

Warning those who are out to stir racial tension, Muhyiddin said the Government had, for more than 55 years, maintained and strengthened unity among the people of various religions and races.

At another function in Batu Kurau, Muhyiddin said the credibility of Opposition Leader Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim was at stake because he had not denied various allegations linked to him.

Anwar's lack of denial over claims that he had 20 foreign bank accounts amounting to RM3bil further compounded the matter, he added.
