

Malaysians urged to reject Opposition's negative values

KUALA LANGAT: Broken promises, being ungrateful and asking others not to repay their debts are Pakatan Rakyat's traits which must be rejected by the people, said Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

The Prime Minister said the Opposition practised three negative values.

"Firstly, they only make empty political promises which they will not fulfil," he said when launching the Ku Sihat District Community Programme at the Perkampungan Orang Asli Pulau Carey yesterday.

He added that being ungrateful was another value practised by the Opposition.

"They even called on others not to repay their loans, which was against religious norms," Najib noted.

"Unlike the Opposition and their bad values, only Barisan Nasional is able to guarantee a future for the country and people," he added.

Najib, who is also Barisan chairman, announced a RM2.6mil allocation to SK Pulau Carey for electricity supply to the school.

He added that some 1,275 Orang Asli households and Indian families living in the area would receive aid in the form of sundry goods and for their children's educational needs.

He also said the Government would hold talks with Sime Darby to allocate land in the area to build houses for the Indians here.

The Ku Sihat programme is jointly organised by Bakti and the Health Promotion Board to assist disabled children.

Earlier, in her welcoming speech, the Najib's wife, who is also Bakti chairman, Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor said 468 district communities had been formed nationwide with 2,615 trained supervisors to help guide 20,184 disabled children.
