

**Najib Asked To Intervene In TWU-SKMK Dispute**

PETALING JAYA, July 4 (Bernama) -- The Peninsular Malaysia Transport Workers Union (TWU) has asked Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak to intervene in its dispute with Syarikat Kenderaan Melayu Kelantan Bhd (SKMK) over the sale of pre-paid tickets and recruitment of drivers.

TWU secretary-general Tan Sri Zainal Rampak said he had sent a letter to the prime minister on July 2 and explained to him the bone of contention between both parties.

He said TWU had to seek Najib's help as SKMK had ignored the collective agreement signed with TWU, Human Resource Minister Datuk Dr S. Subramaniam's decision and the Industrial Court's judgement over the dispute.

Speaking at a news conference here Wednesday, Zainal said SKMK had engaged a contractor to sell fast-pass or pre-paid tickets and recruit non-local drivers supplied by Richgroup Intelligence Advisors Sdn Bhd, much to the dismay of its employees.
