

Not Impossible For BN To Get Two-thirds Majority - Ahmad Maslan

KUALA LUMPUR, July 8 (Bernama) -- Umno information chief Datuk Ahmad [MASlan](#) said it was not impossible for Barisan Nasional (BN) to get a two-thirds majority in parliament in the upcoming general election.

"In politics, there is no such thing as 'impossible' - we in Umno did not expect Selangor and Penang to fall to the opposition in the last elections. So we have high hopes that these two states will be ours again."

He told this to Bernama after opening the Petaling Jaya Utara Umno Youth delegates meeting 2012 at the Bukit Kiara Equestrian Club, here, Sunday.

On Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim's intention to retire from politics if the opposition fails to get the people's mandate in the 13th general election, Ahmad said it was only a gimmick to fish for votes of the fence-sitters.

Meanwhile, Lembah Pantai Umno division chief Datuk Raja Nong Chik Raja Zainal Abidin who is also Federal Territories and Urban Wellbeing Minister, said Anwar was merely applying "old-fashioned politics" to gain the people's sympathy.

"If he really wants to serve the people, it is not necessary to hold power or helm the government leadership," he said after opening the Titiwangsa Umno division annual general meeting here.
