

MP Apologises For Remark Over Ambiga

KUALA LUMPUR, June 28 (Bernama) -- Sri Gading MP Datuk Mohamad Aziz Thursday retracted a remark on the issue of having Bersih 3.0 co-chairman Datuk S. Ambiga hanged for treason, although it was decided that he was not wrong in the matter.

"I am a disciplined individual, mine is a disciplined party. If it had hurt the feelings of my Indian friends, MIC and PPP leaders, and in the spirit of understanding within the BN, I retract the remark," he said.

Mohamad made the retraction after Dewan Rakyat Deputy Speaker Datuk Dr Wan Junaidi Tuanku Jaafar asked him to although it was decided that he had not committed any wrong as he had merely posed a question instead of making a statement and that it did not constitute a threat nor was it racial.

Earlier, Lim Guan Eng (DAP-Bagan) asked Wan Junaidi to determine the action to be taken against Mohamad for having made the remark on Tuesday during the debate on the Supplementary Supply Bill 2012 allocation for the Home Ministry.

Wan Junaidi had said that Mohamad had not committed any wrong by posing the question.
