

Malaysia And China Sign MoU To Combat Trans-border Crime

PUTRAJAYA, Aug 2 (Bernama) -- Malaysia and China Thursday signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on combating trans-border crime at a ceremony held in Beijing, China.

Malaysia was represented by Home Minister Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Hussein and China by his counterpart, Meng Jianzhu.

According to Hishammuddin, the MoU, among other things, touched on cooperation in four main areas, namely law enforcement, training in law enforcement, scientific research and technology exchange.

"The MoU also covers cooperation in tackling related issues such as terrorism, money laundering and terrorism financing, human trafficking, people smuggling, forging of Immigration documents, telecommunication scams and cyber crime," he said in a statement issued, here, today.

Hishammuddin said the signing of the MoU also saw Malaysia's continuous commitment to establishing close cooperation in combating trans-border crime, particularly with foreign enforcement agencies.
