

Mercy Malaysia And Thai Partner Install 11 Water Filtration Systems In Thai Provinces

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 11 (Bernama) -- The Malaysian Medical Relief Society (Mercy Malaysia) together with its Thailand partner, Rural Elderly Entrepreneurship Development Association (Reeda), have installed water filtration systems in 11 locations in the provinces of Chainat and Singburi in Thailand.

Mercy Malaysia deputy executive director Ahmad Faezal Mohamed in a statement today said the water filtration systems were installed in public areas to maximise the availability of clean water to the local populations.
