

Gerakan To Make Two Party Constitutional Amendments At Sept Delegates' Conference

KUALA LUMPUR, Aug 25 (Bernama) -- Gerakan is proposing to make two party constitutional amendments at its national party delegates conference next month, said party president Tan Sri Dr Koh Tsu Koon.

He said there was a need for the two amendments to be tabled for discussion and approval at the two-day conference, beginning Sept 29.

He said the first constitutional amendment was in line with the Universities and University Colleges Act 2012 (AUKU) to enable undergraduates to become Gerakan members.

"As such, we will be abolishing Clause 96.2 of the constitution which does not allow university undergraduates to become members, except with the approval of the vice-chancellor.

"Following the government's amendment of AUKU, Gerakan is of the view that there is no need for the provision and it should be dropped," he said in a media conference at Menara PGRM here Saturday.
