

**Changing Attitude Of Voters Bodes Well For BN In Kelantan, Says Muhyiddin

KOTA BAHARU, Sept 14 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin says the winds of change have blown in Kelantan where the people want to make a major change in their state through the upcoming 13th general election.

He said if Umno and Barisan Nasional (BN) made no mistakes, the desire to see BN win in Kelantan in the elections could be materialised although he admitted that it would not be an easy thing to do.

"I believe there's already change taking place in Kelantan. We do not measure this only from the big turnouts at the events attended by the prime minister and me.

"This is only one of the indications (increasing support for BN), but from the reports and information received from various sources, there is already a change in attitude among voters in Kelantan," he said after opening the Kota Baharu Umno division delegates' meeting and Aidilfitri celebration with the people, here, today.

Muhyiddin, who is also Umno deputy president, said the voters in Kelantan were now fed up with PAS' administration as it had caused them to suffer various problems since 1990.

"They realise that the Kelantan government has been making promises that remain unfulfilled such as solving issues like water supply, housing, infrastructure and building mosques.

"Most of the development we see in Kelantan involve projects contributed by the federal government," he urged

In light of this, Muhyiddin urged the people not to fall for any new promises made by the opposition in the run-up to the general election as they were only aimed at creating hatred for the federal government.

He also asked that no quarters in Umno try to sabotage the party or candidates chosen and he warned them that if they do, they would face the consequences including sacking from the party.

He said the party would appoint independent monitoring individuals unknown to party members, to watch out for acts of sabotage.

"We know the areas with a history or tendency to 'cah keting' (sabotage). They should have won (in the previous elections) but lost because of sabotage.

"I wish to remind party members that Umno and all other BN components are one voice on this matter. If it (sabotage) happens, we will act."

Muhyiddin said acts of sabotage must not be allowed to continue as this upcoming general election was highly important and would be the toughest for BN.

He also urged those divisions which have not made full preparations for the general election to do so quickly as there is still time.
