

**Parliament: Langkawi Incineration Plant To Operate In November**

KUALA LUMPUR, Oct 2 (Bernama) -- The Langkawi incineration plant will start operation in November to process solid waste disposed by residents and improve the quality of service.

Housing and Local Government Minister Datuk Seri Chor Chee Heung said the completion of four incineration plants in Tioman, Cameron Highlands, Pangkor and Labuan can accommodate the needs of residents between 30 and 40 years.

"The decision to build incineration plants were not made in haste but after careful study and from the experience Japan, Korea and Singapore," he said in reply to a question by Datuk Dr Mohd Hayati Othman (PAS-Pendang) in Dewan Rakyat here Tuesday.

Mohd Hayati had asked the Housing and Local Government Ministry on its solid waste disposal plans since many of the waste disposal sites are nearly full.

The Langkawi incineration plant costing RM68 million can process 100 tonnes solid waste daily compared to the 80 tonnes produced by the resort island.
