

**Opposition's Shadow Budget Will Have Negative Impact - Muhyiddin

MIRI, Oct 11 (Bernama) -- Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said today implementing the opposition pact's shadow budget would result in a negative impact on the country.

It would make foreign investors lose confidence in the economic management of the country, he said.

Second Finance Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Husni Hanadzlah had said yesterday that Pakatan Rakyat's shadow budget for 2013 was "mathematically wrong" and misleading, and would definitely increase Malaysia's fiscal deficit and debt against the gross domestic product (GDP) to 7.2 per cent and 57.8 per cent respectively, said Second Finance Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Husni Hanadzlah.

"The Pakatan Rakyat budget is confusing, it is not based on principles of good budgeting," he told reporters after a meeting with the people in Kampung Tanjung Bungai, Bekenu, here.

Muhyiddin said the misleading budget was sound proof that the opposition pact made unrealistic promises.

Earlier, in his address, Muhyiddin announced an allocation of RM5 million to improve tourist infrastructure facilities in Sibuti.

Sarawak Tourism Minister Datuk Abang Johari Tun Openg, in his speech, had asked the federal government to provide RM8 million to improve tourist infrastructure facilities in Sibuti.

"The tourism potential of Sibuti is huge considering that it is located by the coast," he said.
