

**Government Also Focusing On Specific Micro Economic Issues - Nor Mohamed

KLANG, Oct 27 (Bernama) -- The government is now focusing on specific micro economic issues in efforts to assist groups which have not caught up with the development in the country, said Minister in Prime Minister's Department Tan Sri Nor Mohamed Yakcop.

"Apart from focusing on macro-economic issues, the government is also prioritising micro economics in order to help those who have not fully experienced the prosperity in the country," he said at a press conference after opening Power Malaysia's graduation ceremony, here today.

Among the initiatives taken were a RM14 million allocation for various programmes involving the Indian community for the year, including extra tutoring for remove class students from Tamil schools, he added.

"The government has carried out a pioneer project to help 200 Indian students in remove classes from Sepang, Kapar and Klang, which was very successful," said Nor Mohamed.

Meanwhile, Power Malaysia president, Mohana Muniandy said 280 Indian women nationwide have undergone skills training in the past two years, with a RM1 million allocation from the Economic Planning Unit in the Prime Minister's Department.
