

DAP does not represent 'middle Malaysia', says Najib

SANDAKAN: DAP does not represent 'middle Malaysia' or the spirit of racial unity when all eight Malay DAP leaders failed in the party's central executive committee (CEC) elections on Saturday, said Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

He said that would not happen within Barisan Nasional (BN) that practises fairness to all the races in Malaysia and had a clear direction for the country.

"We also see that DAP is not only dominated by one race, that is the Chinese, but also by a family dynasty where Lim Kit Siang received the highest vote while his son Lim Guan Eng came in second.

"Not only the Malays lose to the Chinese, but even the Indians failed to be elected to the committee," he said when opening the Liberal Democratic Party 23rd general assembly.

Najib called on the people to continue supporting BN which practises unity under the 1Malaysia concept and which was also evident in its Cabinet.

"Malaysia lies within a good partnership known as Barisan Nasional. Believe me, we (Malaysia under BN government) will go places, our economy will soar and investors will be more confident," he said.

The prime minister also said the BN government will continue to give out assistance in various fields such as education and business.
