

**Umno Youth delegates train guns on Pakatan

KUALA LUMPUR: Umno Youth delegates went on the offensive against Pakatan Rakyat at the movement's general assembly here Wednesday, training their guns on Opposition leaders as the movement geared up for the upcoming general election.

Penang Umno delegate Norman Zahalan took a swipe at Penang Chief Minister and DAP secretary-general Lim Guan Eng by calling him "Robin Eng", a twisted version of the legendary Robin Hood.

"Barisan Nasional took money from the rich to help the poor but this Robin Eng took money from the poor to help the rich.

"It is quite obvious when he could not explain the controversy surrounding Kampung Manggis in Penang," Norman said.

Kedah Umno Youth delegate Aminuddin Omar had the crowd in stitches when he claimed Kedahans could only receive aid from the PAS-led state government after they died.

He began his debate by mockingly praising the Kedah government for distributing RM500 as aid to the families of those who passed away.

"Umno distributed the RM500 Bantuan Rakyat 1Malaysia (BR1M) aid as well as other incentives but PAS only gives aid to people after they die", he said to laughter from the audience.

"PAS has not fulfilled its promises and pledges to the people, so let us bang the gongs of war as we look forward to erasing the nightmare of the 2008 general election," he said.

Selangor representative Latt Shahrizan Abdullah highlighted the Selangor government's failure to deliver its promises.

"I would also like to ask what happened to the Sept 16 promise to take over power, and where are the growth-driving projects, job and housing opportunities to help the economy?

"They also promised openness, but where is the openness in their handling of the Talam issue, which is a waste of public money?" Latt Shahrizan queried.

Malacca's Azman Abdullah urged Malay youths who had supported Pakatan in 2008 to realise that the Opposition was not the true guardian of the Malays and Islam.

"PKR is busy with ideas on pluralism while PAS is busy with their own brand of hudud and declaring other Muslims apostate, so I urge you to unite with us instead," he said.

Johor Umno Youth Chief Datuk Zulkarnain Kamisan said the party's machinery, especially its youth wing, was fully-prepared and confident to face the Opposition in the upcoming general election.

Perak representative Khairil Shahril Mohamed urged Umno Youth members to ensure they continued to engage young voters to help Barisan secure a strong win at the general election.
