

Integrity Of Sabah Opposition Party To Helm The State Questioned

KOTA KINABALU, Jan 3 (Bernama) -- The Sabah Barisan Nasional (BN) has questioned the integrity of the opposition in helming the state as it has failed to submit the list of its shadow cabinet as promised.

Sabah BN secretary Datuk Abdul Rahman Dahlan said the opposition pact had also not demonstrated solidarity and a spirit of consensus among the component parties.

He said that the opposition pact lately suggested Datuk Seri Panglima Lajim Ukin (former Umno Supreme Council member) to be the Sabah chief minister if the opposition were to win the general election.

"Lately, he (Lajim) had made several big statements in the media which favoured the opposition pact although he was not a member of any opposition party except being chairman of a movement (Pertubuhan Pakatan Perubahan Rakyat)," he said at a media conference at the Sabah Umno Building, here Thursday.

As such, he said, the people should be wise in evaluating Lajim's performance and effectiveness when he was holding several key positions in the government.
