

**Support From Leaders, Public Important For Success Of National Transformation Agenda – Muhyiddin

KUALA TERENGGANU, March 22 (Bernama) -- The nation's transformation agenda cannot be achieved without a good relationship and support between leaders and the community to carry out programmes planned by the Barisan Nasional (BN) government, said Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin.

Describing the continuous transformation plan implemented by the government since three years ago as a major success, he said the achievements of the Federal government were also made possible because of the support of state governments.

"The Government Transformation Programme (GTP) Annual Report for 2012 released on Tuesday shows the efforts taken by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak on the national transformation agenda have produced outstanding results.

"This clearly indicates the devotion of our government's leadership in carrying out changes for the country in terms of economic transformation programmes, government transformation programme, political and social transformation programmes, which have done extremely well," he said.

He said this when speaking at a people's gathering held at the Teluk Pasu Community Service Centre in Kampung Petai Bubus, here Friday.

More than 10,000 people attended the gathering.

Also present were his wife, Puan Seri Norainee Abdul Rahman, Terengganu Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Ahmad Said and wife Toh Puan Seri Norliza Mahmud and , Youth and Sports Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Shabery Cheek.

Muhyiddin and his wife had earlier spent time visiting a senior citizen, Tuan Kamariah Tuan Dalam, 95, who suffered a stroke, at her home in Kampung Petai Bubus, Manir, after he performed Friday prayers at the village's mosque.

He said Malaysia was the only country where the government gave yearly reports on what was being planned and what was achieved.

"No other government in the world does what we do today. We are always open and transparent in our efforts and have nothing to hide," he said.

In his speech, Muhyiddin said that transformation allowed the country's progress to be enjoyed by all levels of society through various government aid, which especially helped the lower-income group.

He said the country's poverty rate had also reached its lowest level, 1.7 per cent, through the transformation programmes.

He said the Prime Minister had stated that the country was in a good economic position last year, with a growth rate of 5.6 per cent.

Muhyiddin also took the chance to congratulate Terengganu for having the highest number of top scorers in the Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) examinations.

He added that a RM1.5-million allocated was approved for a development project in Kuala Nerus, which included RM160,000 to repair the Kampung Petai Bubus Mosque.
