

**Kit Siang "Running Away" From Voters In Ipoh Timur After Failing To Serve Them

SEREMBAN, April 9 (Bernama) -- DAP veteran Lim Kit Siang's move to contest the Gelang Patah parliamentary seat is seen as him wanting to "run away" from his voting supporters in Ipoh Timur after failing to serve the constituents.

Negeri Sembilan MCA chairman Dr Yeow Chai Thiam said after failing to provide services, the DAP adviser decided to contest in another place where the voters did not know his actual service record, with Lim hoping the voters there (Gelang Patah) would vote for him.

"Based on DAP's history, its leaders would not contest in the same area for more than two terms and would then move to another area. This is what Lim and his son Guan Eng have been doing.

"This is the DAP leaders' culture of hopping from one seat to another. There is no reason for them to do so other than having failed to serve their constituents well. In a new area, most of the voters would be duped into supporting them as they are unaware of these leaders' background," he said, here, today.

Yeow said Lim's action showed his disregard for the voters in Ipoh Timur and would now be "preying" on the voters in Gelang Patah to serve his personal interest.

He hoped the voters in Gelang Patah would judge wisely and not be deceived by Lim's tactic as he was trying to hide his weaknesses.

Likewise in Negeri Sembilan, Yeow noted state DAP chairman Loke Siew Fook's intention to contest the Chennah state seat, leaving his old seat of Lobak. Loke is also the incumbent for the Rasah parliamentary seat.

"If he (Loke) is brave enough, he should accept our challenge of going back to Lobak to contest against a young leader from MCA," he said.
