

Bernama Radio24 To Provide Total Coverage On 13th General Election

KUALA LUMPUR, April 16 -- Bernama Radio24 (BR24) will give total coverage on the 13th general election through field reports and interviews from its studio in Wisma Bernama, here.

Chief operations officer Azlan Idris said in line with the slogan 'Bernama Radio24 - Stesen Pilihan Info PRU13 Anda' (Bernama Radio24 - Your Favourite Election Info Station), BR24 will begin sending journalists to locations this Thursday.

"Our field reports will focus on several parliamentary and state constituencies regarded as hot in Kuala Lumpur, Selangor, Perak, Penang, Kedah and Johor.

"Besides that, journalists from Bernama bureaus nationwide will give live reports from other areas," said Azlan.

In addition to field reports, BR24 has prepared special segments to provide listeners information through its frequency FM93.9 in the Klang Valley and FM107.5 in Johor.

Listeners in other areas can tune in via streaming at www.radio24.com.my or on their mobile phones at www.radio24.ada.fm.

According to Azlan, the existing segments such as the 'Ala Carte Pagi' which goes on air at 8.30am and 'Dalam Radar' at 6.10pm from Monday to Friday will feature topics on the elections.

"Dalam Radar has already discussed topics related to the 13th general election since Parliament was dissolved on April 3, while the Ala Carte Pagi programme will touch on the topic from April 22 to May 3," he said.

Azlan said BR24 had also begun new segments such as 'Bicara Negara' with the cooperation of the Sekretariat Ilmuan Malaysia.

It begun airing on Dec 27, 2012, featuring religious personalities and discusses religious issues in Malaysia every Thursday at 4.15pm.

The Tanah Tumpahnya Darahku capsule, a special broadcast for the elections, will make way for the public's voice and expressions for the country.

Besides frequency broadcasts and audio streaming, Azlan said BR24 would also post the complete election results on its website and updates through its Facebook and Twitter page.

Azlan said the station had experience covering the 12th general election in 2008 and was confident it would be able to provide listeners with the election information and results fast.
