

**BN Will Continue Implementing Pro-Business Policies - Muhyiddin

KUALA LUMPUR, April 22 (Bernama) -- Barisan Nasional (BN) will continue implementing pro-business initiatives for the benefit of the business community if given the mandate to helm the country said Deputy Prime Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin.

He said since the policies implemented will benefit the Chinese community, it was vital for the Chinese voters to ensure their representatives are present in the BN line up and be involved in drafting government policies, especially those related to business.
