

**Najib Announces Two Additional 'Aku Janji' For Selangor**

SUNGAI BULOH, April 22 (Bernama) -- Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak Monday night announced two additional 'Aku Janji ' (pledges) for Selangor, which include reviewing the rate for change in use of agriculture land to industry for Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) if the Barisan Nasional was returned to power in the state in the 13th general election (GE13).

He said the current rate imposed by the existing state government was high.

Apart from that, he said, BN would also build new roads in SME industrial areas in Sungai Buloh in view of the fact that the main road in the second biggest area in the country was no longer suitable.

"Initially, I wanted to take a bus here, but was not able to do so because the road here is narrow.

"So, I am adding another Aku Janji for Selangor, that is if BN wins back Selangor, we will build new roads here," he said at a meet-the- people session in Kampung Baru Sungai Buloh.

Najib said the Pakatan Rakyat manifesto which pledged to increase a household income to RM4,000 a month could make the country and SME operators bankrupt because they would not be able to pay the salaries of their workers.

"Even to pay a minimum salary of RM900 a month, the SMEs say they can become bankrupt, imagine RM4,000, can you afford it, you work very hard, but if you have to pay RM4,000 a month you will go bankrupt," he added.

He said the SME operators wanted to see their business expand but they would be bankrupt if they had to pay their workers RM4,000 a month each.

"The profits they make has also to be invested for expansion and new and latest machines so that they make more profits and thus be able to give better salaries to their workers," he added.

Najib regarded the opposition's manifesto as an irresponsible document that could lead to the destruction of economy.

"I know what can and cannot be done. As the prime minister, I will not allow this country to go down the drain just to get votes from the rakyat. I am the leader who cares for the nation, I will be equally responsible to ensure this country will be well managed," he added.

Najib, who is also Selangor BN chairman, said he hoped that the people would not allow themselves to continue to be hoodwinked by the opposition parties.

"You can fool people once but you cannot fool people all the time, a ship cannot have three captains. Their manifesto did not mention the Indian community, but we mentioned a lot about the Indians.

"That is why the Indians are all supportive, the HINDRAF (Hindu Youth Rights Action Force) also supports us, previously they were against us, but now they support because they have 'nambikei', which is faith in BN because we have done a lot for the Indian community," he added.

He said the Chinese, Malays and Indians in the country should work together as a family for the country to remain peaceful and harmonious.

"If we fight among ourselves, the country will be destroyed, businesses will suffer, economy and shares will drop. If we want to succeed, we must create an atmosphere of peace and harmony," he added.

Najib said the people should not experiment with something that could be destructive to the country, but to have confidence in the BN's capability to administer a multi-racial country.

He said since the past four years, Malaysia had received various accolades, especially in the economic field, including from the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

"This is just the beginning of our transformation journey. We must not lose the momentum. We cannot slow down. We have the momentum but if we slow down, other countries will overtake us, like Indonesia, Vietnam and Thailand," he added.

He said what was crucial was political stability because it would boost the people's confidence and also allow the government to formulate various policies, not only for the short term, but also long term.

"If I have another five years, I am confident Vision 2020 will be a reality. Believe me, what we want is a developed Malaysia, an advanced, high income nation where every Malaysian enjoys the benefits," he added.

At the function, Najib also opened the hall of Sekolah Jenis Kebangsaan Cina Sungai Buloh to commemorate his first visit to Kampung Baru Sungai Buloh.
