

**Opposition Not Capable Of Forming Stable Government - Najib

SIBU, April 27 (Bernama) -- The opposition is not capable of forming a stable and successful government for the alliance is not formed through similar understanding, said Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak.

The prime minister said ideological differences between PAS and the DAP and the turmoil in Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) would ignite squabbles and eventually lead to political instability.

"With DAP and PAS continuing to argue on hudud and overlapping of PAS and PKR candidates in this election, we are confident that the discordant alliance will continue to quarrel if they were to form the government.

"For us, Barisan Nasional (BN) may not be perfect, but we actually did better than them. The country's development is on the right path under the BN government," he said at the gathering of people here Saturday night.

Present were his wife, Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor and BN candidate for the Sibul parliamentary seat Lau Lee Ming and BN candidate for the Lanang parliamentary seat Datuk Tiong Thai King.

Urging the people not to fall for the opposition's false promises," he said, "Believe me, as finance minister, I know it is not easy to lower oil prices and tolls or abolish PTPTN, many aspects needed to be taken into consideration.

"You cannot reduce everything at once. In fact, we have implemented some of their promises."

Najib, who is also BN chairman, said the people could pursue radical change like the 'Arab Spring' or allow the government to make gradual changes for toppling the government through uprising would bring more harm than good to the people.

He said in the Malaysian context, investors, who were confident in the BN transformation policy, would aspire for continuity of the government.

The prime minister said the opposition were already dreaming of Putrajaya despite the people's support was otherwise.

Urging the people of Sarawak not to be influenced by the opposition's dream, he said, "We lost narrowly in Sibul before, but now a change has occurred and the people are coming back to BN."

Najib said he would work hard and do his best for the people of Sarawak, including that of Sibul and Lanang.

"The strength I have is derived from the trust entrusted upon me by the people. But I cannot do it alone, I need my team to help me.

"So I need you to vote for my friends who are standing in Sibul and Lanang and in 220

(parliamentary) constituencies in the country under the BN's banner," he added.
