

**BN Polls Machinery Working On Increased Momentum, Says Najib

PONTIAN, April 29 (Bernama) -- The Barisan Nasional's (BN) election machinery country-wide has been working on increased momentum over the last few days than the opposition which appears to be mired in opposing views, Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Tun Razak said Monday.

He said their misunderstanding and lack of consensus were visible when the allies in the opposition pact were often seen having differences in opinion on core issues.

"This is a clear indication that the opposition pact is a very fragile and a loose coalition of three parties which have no future.

"I'm not denying the BN has problems but a major part of our problems have been resolved unlike the opposition pact which is facing more problems and they are in a state of disarray.

"If we have problems, the opposition has even more problems. If I say the BN has no problems, that's not right.

"If I were to compare to the opposition's perspective, they have much more problems. We don't have component parties quarrelling among ourselves, the opposition has," said Najib, who is also BN chairman, after addressing a people's gathering at Dataran Pasar Lambak in Pekan Nenas today.

The gathering were also attended by Najib's wife, Datin Seri Rosmah Mansor, Menteri Besar Datuk Abdul Ghani Othman, Home Minister Datuk Seri Hishammuddin Tun Hussein and Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Datuk Ahmad Maslan.

The BN's candidate for Tanjung Piai parliamentary seat Datuk Wee Jack Seng, the coalition's nominees for Kukup state seat Suhaimi Salleh and Pekan Nenas state seat Wong You Fong were also present.

Najib said the bickerings among the opposition allies were an indication that the opposition pact was fragile.

"They try to cover up their quarrels and their ideology clash by focusing attention to defeat BN in this polls, this is very dangerous.

"They don't portray a picture that they are a viable pact which can be trusted. If we want to manage a government, we need close and strong cooperation (from our component parties)," he said.

Najib expressed confidence that Johor BN would be returned to power with a thumping victory, securing more seats than in the 2008 general election.
