

**Muhyiddin Calls On The People To Defend Life's Values From Negative Culture**

KLUANG, April 30 (Bernama) -- Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin on Tuesday called on the people to rise and defend the life's values which they have nurtured up to now from the influence of what he branded as the negative culture the opposition was trying to instil in the people.

The deputy prime minister and Barisan Nasional (BN) deputy chairman said the opposition was trying to instil negative culture such as gangsterism, slander, heresy, disunity and confrontation in the people.

"The people must rise to defend the life's values that we hold. Don't let them destroy those values. We must defend them from the scourge of the opposition," he said at a 1Malaysia People's Gathering at the Che Luan Khor Hall, here.

Muhyiddin also called on the people to think about the consequences should they make the wrong decision on polling day on Sunday in the 13th General Election.

He said that should that happen, Malaysia would probably see an uncertain future and the destruction of what had been built all these years.

Also present were the BN candidates for the Kluang parliamentary seat and the Mahkota and Mengkibol state seats, Dr Hou Kok Chung, Jais Sarday and Chye Kwee Yeow, respectively.

Muhyiddin said Parti Keadilan Rakyat (PKR) de facto leader Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, for example, had wanted to abolish the anti-sodomy law as he claimed it was archaic and out of date.

The deputy prime minister said the anti-sodomy law would be among the first laws to be abolished by Anwar if he were to become the prime minister.

"I don't know why Anwar is so keen on abolishing the (anti-sodomy) law," he said, adding that sodomy was an offence against religion and law, as well as life's values.

Therefore, he said, the people of Johor must vote for the BN if they wanted to see rapid development continue in the various sectors in the state.

Muhyiddin said political stability and the implementation of suitable policies by the BN government in Johor had enabled the state to be a major draw of foreign investors.

Over the past few years, he said, Johor had managed to attract investment totalling RM200 billion, with RM100 billion in Iskandar Malaysia and the remainder in the development of the oil and gas industry in Pengerang.

The flood of foreign and local investors in Johor has also created hundreds of thousands of jobs, besides other opportunities for the local people, he said.

"I would like to ask, do we really want to destroy what we have accomplished today? A mistake in the decision made on May 5 will give a very deep impact to the Johor economy," he said, and expressed the hope that the people would not gamble away their future by

voting for the opposition.
