

**Opposition Untiringly Deceiving The Rakyat - Muhyiddin

KUANTAN, May 2 (Bernama) -- Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin said the opposition parties are now seen to be deceiving the people openly by making sweet promises merely to win in the general election on May 5.

The Deputy Prime Minister said the pledges contained in the opposition pact's manifesto were highlighted in their campaigns without considering the economic impact on the country and people.

In reality, they had never been able to fulfil their pledges previously after winning several states in 2008, he said.

"Looking at it (opposition manifesto) briefly, it appears good, but it is daylight deception," he said at the 1Malaysia People's Gathering programme at Taman Tas, near here today.

He said pledges such as abolishing the toll, reducing fuel prices, abolishing the National Higher Education Fund Corporation (PTPTN), raising the minimum salary to RM1,200 and various others, certainly sounded good but in reality, it would have a negative impact on the national economy.

"Where are they going to get the fund for all these? Petronas? If all the Petronas money is taken, the 'golden goose' eventually will not lay any more egg," he said.

He said that since the BN government was given the mandate continuously for the past 55 years, it had carried out the trust to ensure Malaysia remained progressive, peaceful and in prosperity.

"That's why on May 5, the decider for the future, vote wisely, rationally, without emotion and coercion from any group, one vote will determine the future. Any mistake will mean a dark future.

"They (opposition) say 'we change'..No necessity, why should there be a change? Is Malaysia in chaos? Are the people too poor to eat? The government does not provide job opportunities? There is no such problem in Malaysia, there may be a problem of too much food, in Malaysia, there are many restaurants that are open for 24 hours...so, we should not be fooled by their manifesto. InsyaAllah, we will deliver our promises. Keep the manifesto and demand for the pledges later," he said.

Meanwhile, Pahang Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Adnan Yaakob, in his speech, said the people should think rationally before making their choice on May 5.

He said the opposition seemed to be more desperate to the extent that they were willing to spread various slanders to incite the people and criticise the government.

"They have even come up with the slogan 'Mari Bersihkan Malaysia' (Let's Clean Up Malaysia) as though Malaysia is that dirty, are we not peaceful now? Are the people going hungry?" Adnan said.

Also present were the BN candidates for the Paya Besar parliamentary constituency, Datuk

Abdul Manan Ismail, Sungai Lembing state constituency, Datuk Md Sohaimi Mohamed Shah, Lepar state constituency, Mohd Shohaimi Jusoh, and Pancing state constituency, Datuk Mohd Zaili Besar.
